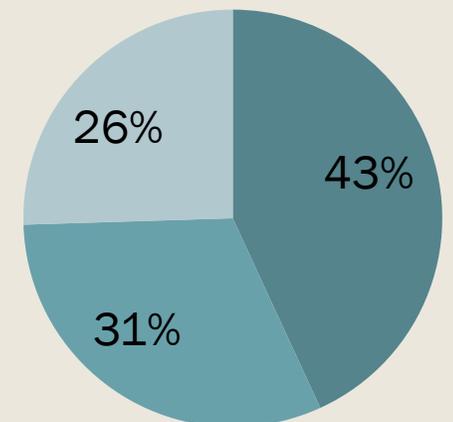


Findings

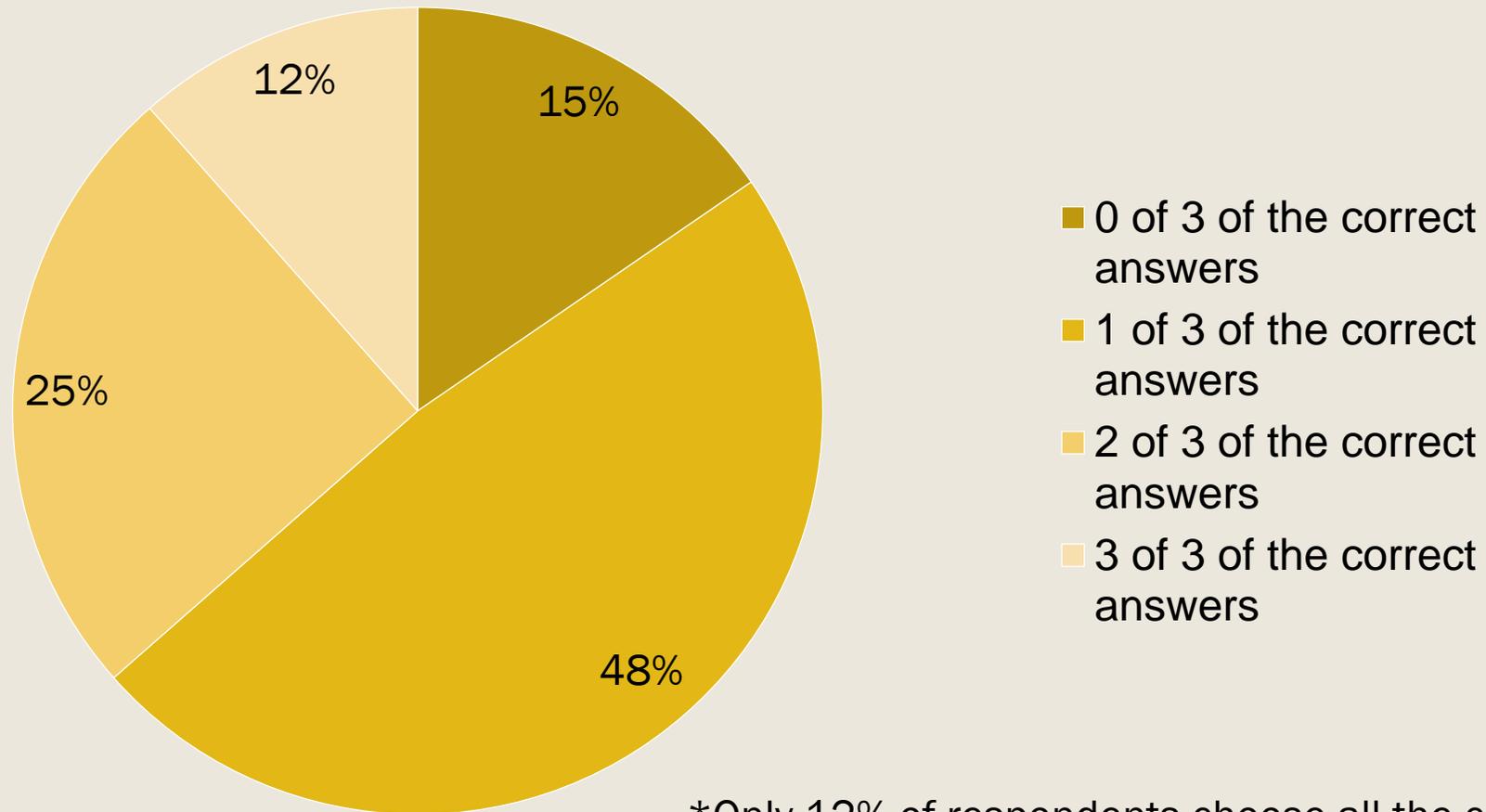
- There is a lack of media literacy among children and adults; media education is required in order to elevate media literacy levels around Armenia.
- Constant debates are happening to decide which is more important in child's media education, parents or school, so initiative from both are needed to increase media literacy levels among children.
- Only 12% of respondents of the survey could correctly define what media literacy is and around 30 % of respondents think that media education should not be included in schools.
- 51% of respondents control their child's media use and females are more likely to control than males

- ❖ guaranteeing that educational materials developed for educational institutions
- ❖ reviewing some subjects, namely Social Sciences class program, with the purpose of integrating media literacy in that class

Recommendations

- ❖ Design and implement trainings with parents in order to encourage dialogue between them and their children and encourage making parental media mediation from indirect to active.
- ❖ Develop comprehensive media education guides and programs at all education levels.
- ❖ Conduct trainings for teachers and school directors.
- ❖ Include media education in Armenian State Pedagogical University's program
- ❖ Promote create project production by children and young people and exchange the experiences to achieve more results.
- ❖ Recognize, award and promote productions by children and young people
